Do you have or are you in a category at risk for contracting or spreading COVID-19? At risk categories are those:	Can vote absentee under excuse #7: (7) For an election that occurs during the year 2020, the voter has contracted or is in an at-risk category for contracting or transmitting severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus (For 2020 only)	NO	By email, fax, in-person or by mail Can vote absentee in person at local election office during the six weeks before the election.	Request for mailballot must be received by 2nd Wednesday before Election Day July 22: primary Oct.21: general Can vote absentee in person until 5p.m. day before Election Day	Can be returned in- person or by mail, by voter or a close relative of voter	Ballot must be received by close of polls on Election Day
Vote by mail available to any Missouri voter in 2020 without an excuse.	Any voter can vote by mail for 2020 elections. No excuse required. (For 2020 only)	YES	In-person or by mail	Request for mailballot must be received by 2nd Wednesday before Election Day	Must be returned to the election authority by MAIL only.	Ballot must be received by close of polls on Election Day
